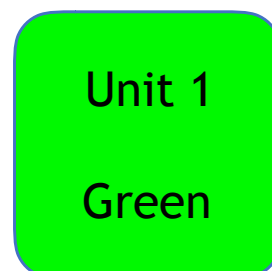
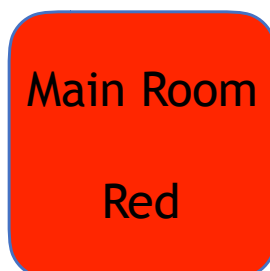
Conference Objectives
